

In the Old Testament, "Hosanna!" meant: Save Us Lord!

Ps. 118:25

O LORD, do save, we beseech You; O LORD, we beseech You, do send prosperity! (also see 1 Chron. 16:35-36; Ps. 106:47-48)





It's like all of mankind was stranded in the open sea with only the promise of God of a Savior to come....Isaiah 62:11,12-63:1

Then Jesus came to our RESCUE!

The people saw and were glad...

(Matthew 21:1-11)

And as He (Jesus) came into Jerusalem riding on a donkey, the people laid palm branches (thus "Palm Sunday") on the ground before Him. The Jewish people were welcoming their Messiah, OUR SAVIOR... and they were shouting:

We're Saved! Hosanna!

Hosanna to the Son of David; BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD; Hosanna in the highest!" (Matt. 21:9)
